### Waterfront Boathouse Concession of Non-Motorized Water Craft for the 2024 Season

#### PROPOSAL SPECIFICATIONS

In accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:34-9.4 and Resolution by Mayor and Council of the Borough of Keyport, the Borough of Keyport is seeking proposals for the operation of a waterfront boathouse concession for non-motorized water craft for the 2024 season.

- One-year contract 2024, with Borough option to renew for one (1) additional one-year contract period commencing 4/1/2025 through 3/31/2026 and three (3) additional one-year contracts 4/1/2026 through 3/31/2029 with an aggregate term of five (5) years.
- Operator shall operate to provide recreational activities consistent with the Lease Agreement in order to promote recreational use of the waterfront at the Keyport Boat Ramp.
- The Waterfront Park may be closed by the Borough for health, safety, or other public reasons during this period. The concessionaire shall not be entitled to an adjustment of fees payable to the Borough due to closure of the park, unless the park shall be closed for more than five (5) consecutive days or for more than twenty (20) total days during the summer season.
- Operator shall pay the Borough of Keyport the minimum sum of \$2,500. for the first year of the Lease with a minimum 3.5% increase with each additional year. The Lease payment shall be paid in 2 equal payments yearly on April 1; August 1.
- Lessee/Operator agrees to offer recreational activities as set forth in the Lease Agreement and to actively promote the waterfront within the Borough of Keyport, the County of Monmouth and the State of New Jersey.
- The Lessee/Operator will have background checks for each employee and submitted to the Borough Clerk. Prior to beginning operation, the concessionaire shall submit an authorization for a criminal background on every individual who will be working onsite. At its sole discretion, the Borough, upon reviewing the information obtained in this background check, may prohibit a given individual from working onsite. Additional employees may be added during the course of the season only after successful completion of a criminal background check and approval by the Borough.
- The Operator shall provide a Hold Harmless Agreement in favor of the Borough.
- The Operator shall provide evidence of insurance in a form and amount that is approved by the Borough's Risk Manager. This shall include evidence that the Insured is covered for an Operator's exposure, not just the exposure associated with being a distributor.

- No one will be permitted on the boat without the Lessee/Operator having a life preserver for each participant, be available if needed.
- A listing of rental prices that include maximum prices to be charged. Prices shall be comparable with prices charged for similar items in Keyport and vicinity. Deviation from the submitted price list, either by adding items or deleting, may be done only with the permission of the Borough.
- Employees of the concessionaire while on site shall dress in clean clothes, wearing shirts, pants or skirts, and shoes appropriate to the season, no bikini tops, short shorts or sandals.
- Concessionaire shall secure all equipment and any materials left on site during the time it is unattended.
- The Borough shall not be responsible for any losses or damage to equipment or materials, whether or not they are secured.
- The Concessionaire shall be responsible for keeping the boathouse and the immediate vicinity clean and orderly, and shall dispose of all rubbish and waste off-site.
- When possible, deliveries shall be before start of scheduled day and coordinated with Borough staff.
- The Concessionaire shall answer to the Borough Administrator during business hours and shall contact the Borough Administrator through Police Dispatch after hours.
- Minimum proposal \$2,500 per year for the first year of the agreement and a minimum 3.5% increase years two through five.
- Revision and Addenda to any specifications will be posted on the Borough of Keyport website <a href="https://www.keyportonline.com">www.keyportonline.com</a> and will be the responsibility of the bidder to obtain.

Proposals will be evaluated based on highest payment proposal and other factors.

- 1.1 PROPOSAL OPENING: All proposals will be publicly opened and read by the Keyport Borough Clerk on Thursday, January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 11:30 a.m. EST in the Council Chambers, Keyport Borough Hall, 70 West Front Street, Keyport, New Jersey. Bid proposals may be delivered by hand or by mail to the Borough Clerk, Borough Hall, 70 West Front Street, New Jersey 07735 no later than 10:30 A.M. on Thursday, January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2024. All proposals will be dated and time stamped upon receipt. Bidder is solely responsible for the timely delivery of the proposal and no proposals shall be considered which are presented after the public call for receiving of proposals. Any proposal received after the date and time specified shall be returned, unopened to the bidder.
- 1.2 **DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED**: The following documents, properly executed, shall be submitted by every bidder at the time and date specified in the public notice to bidders:

- 1. Questionnaire setting forth experience and qualifications with Affidavit;
- 2. Bid Guaranty in the form of a bid bond, certified check or cashier's check in the amount of ten percent (10%) of twice the amount bid for the first year of the five (5) aggregate year term rent, not to exceed the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), payable to the Borough of Keyport;
- 3. Consent of Surety;
- 4. Non-collusion affidavit;
- 5. Statement of ownership;
- 6. Standard Proposal
- 7. Business Entity Disclosure
- 8. Political Contribution Disclosure
- 9. Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran
- 10. Business Registration Certificate

All of the foregoing documents shall be submitted in accordance with the instructions hereinafter provided. The division of the within bid specifications into parts is merely for convenience and ready reference; all parts of the bid specifications including the proposed Lease Agreement shall constitute a single document.

#### **SECTION 2. PROPOSAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- 2.1 **PROPOSAL**. Each bidder shall comply with the following requirements relative to the preparation and submission of any proposal:
  - A. No bidder shall submit the requested information on any other form other than those provided in these proposal specifications, except as where otherwise provided.
  - B. Bid proposals shall be hand delivered or mailed in a sealed envelope addressed to the Borough Clerk, and the name and address of the bidder and the name of the bid "Waterfront Boathouse Concession" must be clearly written on the outside of the sealed envelope. No proposal shall be accepted past the date and time specified by the Borough of Keyport in the advertisement for proposals and in the within invitation to submit a proposal.
  - C. Each bidder shall sign, where applicable.
  - D. Any bid proposal submitted which does not comply with the requirements of the bid specifications contained herein may be rejected as non-responsive.

- 2.2 <u>BID GUARANTY</u>. A Bid Guaranty in the form of the form of a Bid Bond, Certified Check or Cashier's Check made payable to the order of the Borough of Keyport in the amount of ten percent (10%) of twice the amount for the first year of the five (5) year aggregate Lease term, not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), must accompany each bid submitted. In the event the successful bidder to whom the contract is awarded fails to enter into the contract in the manner and within the time specified, the award shall be rescinded and the bid guaranty posted shall be retained by the Borough of Keyport as liquidated damages.
- 2.3 **EXCEPTIONS TO THE BID SPECIFICATIONS.** Any conditions, limitations, provisos, amendments, alterations or other changes attached or added by the bidder to any of the provisions of these bid specifications or any changes made by the bidder on the proposal forms may result in the rejection of the bid proposal by the governing body.
- 2.4 <u>COMPLIANCE</u>. The bidder shall be familiar with and comply with all applicable local, county, state and federal laws and regulations in the submission of the bid proposal and, if bidder is awarded the contract, in performance of that contract.
- 2.5 <u>CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND NON-COLLUSION</u>. Each bidder must execute and submit as part of the bid proposal a "Non-Collusion Affidavit" which shall at a minimum attest that:
  - A. The bidder has not entered into any Agreement or participated in any collusion with any other person, corporate entity or government entity, or competitive bidding either alone or with any other person, corporate entity in connection with the within project; and
  - B. All statements made in the bid proposal are true and correct and made with the full knowledge that the contracting unit relies upon the truth of those statements in awarding the contract.

#### **SECTION 3. AWARD OF CONTRACT**

#### 3.1 **GENERALLY**

- A. The Governing Body shall award the contract or reject all proposals submitted within the time specified in the invitation to submit a proposal, but in no case after more than 60 days from the proposal opening, except that the proposals of any bidders who consent thereto may, at the request of the contracting unit, be held for consideration for such a longer period as the bidder and contracting unit may agree. All bidders will be notified of the decision of the Governing Body, in writing.
- B. The contract will be awarded to the highest responsible bidder; unless the Mayor and Council elect to reject all bids received.
- C. The Mayor and Council reserve the right to reject any bid not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provision hereof, or to reject all bids submitted.

#### 3.2 NOTICE OF AWARD OF CONTRACT.

Within fourteen (14) days calendar days of the contract award, the Borough of Keyport will notify the successful bidder in writing, at the address set forth in the bid proposal and such notice shall specify the place and time of delivery of the executed Waterfront Boathouse Concession Agreement, the performance bond the certificate of insurance and other such documents required in the Lease Agreement or the within specifications. Failure to deliver the aforementioned documents as specified in the notice of award may be cause for the Borough of Keyport to declare the bidder non-responsive and to award the contract to the next highest bidder. The Borough of Keyport may agree to extend the time for receipt of the within documents.

#### 3.3 ERRORS IN PRICE CALCULATION.

Any discrepancies between a numerical price and a price written in words shall be resolved in favor of the price as written in words. After all proposals have been read, they will be reviewed by the appropriate Borough professionals and any adjustment based upon review or tabulation, if necessary, will be performed consistent with this paragraph.

#### 3.4 RIGHTS RESERVED.

The Borough of Keyport expressly reserves the right to reject any or all bids submitted and to waive any informality where such informality is not detrimental to the best interest of the Borough.

#### BASIS OF AWARD

The concession will be awarded by resolution of the Mayor and Borough Council on the recommendation of the Borough Administrator based on a review of proposals submitted considering the following factors:

- Concession fee payable to the Borough
- Experience and qualifications of prospective concessionaire
- Price of items to be sold

Concessionaire shall have all necessary licenses and shall be operational no later than Saturday prior to Memorial Day or the award shall be considered terminated without further action by the Borough.

#### **Proposal**

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### C. 271 POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE FORM

### **Public Agency Instructions**

This page provides guidance to public agencies entering into contracts with business entities that are required to file Political Contribution Disclosure forms with the agency. It is not intended to be provided to contractors. What follows are instructions on the use of forms local units can provide to contractors that are required to disclose political contributions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 (P.L. 2005, c. 271, s.2).

- 1. The disclosure is required for all contracts in excess of \$17,500 that are not awarded pursuant to a "fair and open" process (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.7).
- 2. Due to the potential length of some contractor submissions, the public agency should consider allowing data to be submitted in electronic form (i.e., spreadsheet, pdf file, etc.). Submissions must be kept with the contract documents or in an appropriate computer file and be available for public access. The form is worded to accept this alternate submission. The text should be amended if electronic submission will not be allowed.
- The submission must be received from the contractor and on file at least 10 days prior to award
  of the contract. Resolutions of award should reflect that the disclosure has been received and is
  on file.
- 4. The contractor must disclose contributions made to continuing political committees (PACs) and candidate committees covering a wide range of public agencies, including all public agencies that have elected officials in the county of the public agency, state legislative positions, and various state entities. The Division of Local Government Services recommends that contractors be provided a list of the affected agencies. This will assist contractors in determining the campaign committees and continuing political committees of the officials and candidates affected by the disclosure.
  - a. The Division has prepared model disclosure forms for each county which can be downloaded from the "County PCD Forms" link on the Pay-to-Play web site at https://www.nj.gov/dca/divisions/dlgs/programs/pay\_2\_play.html. These forms will be updated from time-to-time as necessary.
  - b. A public agency using these forms should edit them to properly reflect the correct legislative district(s). As the forms are county-based, they list all legislative districts in each county. Districts that do not represent the public agency should be removed from the lists.
  - c. Some contractors may find it easier to provide a single list that covers all contributions, regardless of the county. These submissions are appropriate and should be accepted.
  - d. The form may be used "as-is", subject to edits as described herein.
  - e. The "Contractor Instructions" sheet is intended to be provided with the form. It is recommended that the Instructions and the form be printed on the same piece of paper. The form notes that the Instructions are printed on the back of the form; where that is not the case, the text should be edited accordingly.
  - f. The form is a Word document and can be edited to meet local needs, and posted for download on web sites, used as an e-mail attachment, or provided as a printed document.
- 5. It is recommended that the contractor also complete a "Ownership Disclosure Certification." This will assist the local unit in its obligation to ensure that contractor did not make any prohibited contributions to the committees listed on the Business Entity Disclosure Certification in the 12 months prior to the contract. A sample Certification form is part of this package and the instruction to complete it is included in the Contractor Instructions. NOTE: This section is not applicable to Boards of Education.

"interest" means the ownership or control of more than 10% of the profits or assets of a business entity or 10% of the stock in the case of a business entity that is a corporation for profit, as appropriate;
