Sign-Up Dates & Fee:

- Keyport Residents: Starting Monday, December 15, 2025 No Fee
- Non-Keyport Residents: Starting Friday, January 2, 2026 \$50 Annual Fee (Calendar Year)
- Payable by Cash, Check written to "Borough of Keyport" or by credit card (3% processing fee applies)

Forms: Applications will be available in the Center Office for pick-up.

Eligibility:

- Open to residents of Keyport and the Bayshore Community who are age 60 or older, or under 60 and disabled.
- Participants must be able to care for themselves independently, including managing personal hygiene and meals.

Important Note:

We do not provide health care or supervision for individuals with dementia or similar conditions. Members must be able to participate safely and independently at the Center and during off-site trips and events.
