SOCIAL WORKER ANN INFORMATION

Food Stamps, otherwise known as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), is a government assistance program created to help lower-income individuals and families afford nutritious food.

SNAP provides monthly benefits through an EBT (Electronic Benefits Transfer) card which can be used at authorized supermarkets and farmer's markets to purchase eligible food items. Food assistance supports the goal of healthy eating and better health outcomes.

The program also helps support local food providers.

Applicants must apply for assistance and meet current financial and residency requirements. Applicants need a current, valid ID; proof of residency, proof of income, proof of resources and a Social Security number or immigration status document. Some college students may be eligible and need to submit proof of student status. Other information may be required.

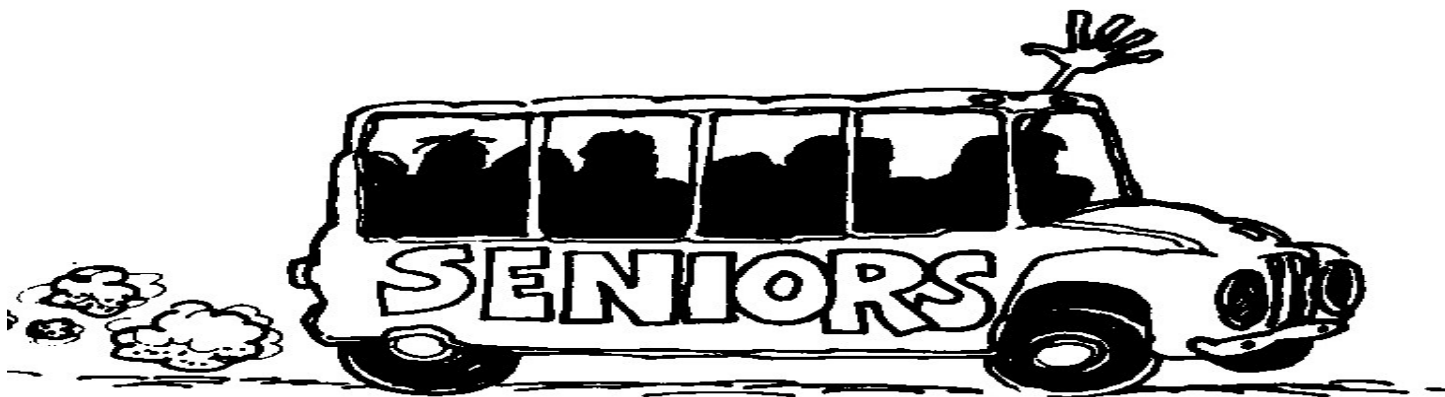
Movies starting at 10:30AM.
