Notes from the Advisory Committee

I'm sure you have heard by now that KSC has partnered with Boro of Highlands to run a 4 day cruise to Canada. Travel is good for us. A change from our normal routines can rejuvenate us, pique our curiosity, and introduce us to a different way of thinking. We try new foods, meet new people, marvel at sights both natural and manmade. Travel gives us an opportunity to relax and enjoy, learn and be entertained. And, Maybe, understand a different culture. October is the perfect time to celebrate all the benefits of travel and still stay close to home. Here are some possibilities:

Try some new foods. Keyport has many restaurants where you can sample foods from all over the world. Nemo, Lucy's Mexican American, McDonagh's. One of the newest is Aangara has all you can eat lunch buffet on Saturday and Sunday from noon to 3:00 where you can sample Indian specialties (\$24.99). The Elks Club Oktober Fest Dinner will feature German food and music (and a Stein holding challenge). Weekly farm markets offer lots of variety and the chance to talk with vendors and customers about what's good. If you have time and a little money to spend *Beyond the Plate* runs walking tours in Red Bank.

Take some time in natural beauty. It may not be the Grand Canyon but the Keyport bayfront has some inspiring vistas. Walk along the water and notice the boats, the light on the bay and New York City in the distance. Sit on the pier or a bench and talk to the people fishing or walking their dogs. Are there painters? Musicians? Get a cup of coffee or an ice cream and sit on the plaza next to Burlews. It's a great way to soak up the atmosphere. "Shinrin-yoku" in Japanese means Forest Bathing. The Arboretum at Holmdel Park is the perfect place to practice. Enjoy the quiet with only the sound of birds breaking the silence. The Monmouth County Park System has many great parks. Many have historical buildings. Longstreet Farm at Holmdel is a working farm circa 1890 and lots to do and see. There are demonstrations of farm chores and practices like baking in the cookstove. Check the Park System's seasonal catalog or website for special events. There is no cost for park entry but their classes require registration and a fee.

Be entertained and enlightened. Did you know that Christian Brothers' Academy Henderson Theater has \$5 Sunday matinees for seniors. Community theater, yes, but the production values are high quality. Bell Theater at Bellworks is another local theater with musical entertainment. Associated with Axelrod Performing Arts Center, many of the performances are tribute bands in a state-of-the-art facility. Bellworks itself is not to be missed. A fun place to walk, shop and eat. Take a look at the weekly markets and other events. Monmouth Museum on the Brookdale campus has changing exhibits and a Wonder Wing for kids. Check your local library for a museum pass. You check out the pass like a book and 2 adults and 2 children will get in free. Other museums are also available. Libraries are a great resource for free programs like crafts for adults, financial topics and even new films.

Open Enrollment 2025 begins on October 15th and ends on December 7th. You are allowed to make changes to your Medicare Part D Plan or your Medicare Advantage Plan during this period. Changes will be effective January 1, 2026.

Be sure to check your mail and read any notices from your current insurance.

For Medicare beneficiaries who are enrolled in PAAD or Extra Help, it is very important to check your Annual Notice of Change. If you have questions or concerns, contact PAAD at 1-800-792-9745.

PAAD Customer Service Agents can view your coverage and answer questions. PAAD is very busy during Open Enrollment. Please be patient. Somedays there are long waits.

If you need additional assistance, please call the senior center at 732-264-4916. Jessi or Kathy will take a message and I will call you back when I am working on Thursdays.
