

# Tax & Water/Sewer Billing Information

Hours of Operation: Monday – Friday, 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM

### **Quarterly Tax Payments:**

- •Due on February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1.
- •A 10-day grace period applies. On the 11th day, interest is accrued back to the 1st of the month, per state law.
- •Tax bills are mailed annually in July/August. If you do not receive a bill, you are still responsible for payment (NJSA54:4-64).
- •If annual bills are mailed late, the due date remains **August 1**. However, under NJSA 54:4-66.3d, a **resolution is passed to delay interest accrual for 25 days**. If payment is made past this date, interest is charged retroactively to August 1.

**Account Updates:** Please submit any changes in writing (e.g., new mailing address, mortgage company changes). Notices can be faxed to **732-739-4701**.

### Water & Sewer Payments:

- •Billed quarterly with due dates on January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1.
- •A 10-day grace period applies. Interest is accrued from the 1st of the month per NJ State Statute.
- •Bills are mailed around the 15th of the previous month.

# Payment Extensions for Weekends & Holidays:

- •If a collection day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, payments are accepted until the following Monday without interest.
- •If the last day to pay is a **holiday**, the next business day is the deadline.

### Payment Options:

- •Drop-Box: Located in the vestibule of 70 West Front Street (No cash payments accepted). Payments are posted on the pickup date (Monday-Friday, 9 AM-10 AM). Payments dropped after 10 AM are posted on the next business day.
- •Online Payments: Visit www.keyportonline.com. Click on Tax and Water Sewer Payments, read notices, and proceed.
- •E-Check: \$1.95 per transaction
- •Credit/Debit Card: 2.95% of the transaction amount
- •Convenience fees are retained by the service provider and not by the Borough of Keyport.

•Schedule a final meter reading to receive a final bill before moving.

- •Residents are responsible for meter upkeep, especially **during winter**.

That year will be recognized and commemorated at the national, State, County, and local levels. You may have already seen advertisements for this major celebration. What can you do to celebrate and/or participate?

The connection between the Revolution celebration and you and your business, organization, or neighborhood block can be a simple accent, complementing what you do every day, or play it up big! Tourism has been cited as a major aspect of the benefits. If you are a business, it can be as simple as having special sales days leading up to the week of July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Involvement at the Borough level will be forming up soon. Mayor Araneo envisions a "Stars and Stripes" Street Fair for the week of July 4, 2026. Monmouth County officials have organized Monmouth250, a group that has spearheaded workshop sessions with all its municipalities. Keyport is already recognized as a "250 Partner!" There are several large-scale events already scheduled in our area. Two key events are June 28, 2026, a county-run 250 Parade in Middletown, and July 3-4, 2026, Sail250 (formerly OpSail) and an event at Earle Naval Base.


### Leaf & Branch Collection Reminder







# **KEYPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT**

# **KEYPORT FIRST AID**



The Keyport Fire Department was established in 1877 by officials and citizens following a devastating fire that destroyed much of the town's business district. Fire wagons were first hauled by hand or horses, with firefighters running to the firehouses, which explains how the seven firehouses became located. As decades evolved,

apparatus became mechanized and self-propelled, and firefighting protective clothing and air packs offered better protection for entering burning buildings. Fire code enforcement through the Fire Marshal's Office, modern building codes, and public education have reduced fire fatalities. Adapting to the nationwide decline in volunteerism, the KFD reorganized in April 2025, becoming a single entity operating from a central location. This has improved response times and increased efficiency. The traditions and history of the KFD are preserved and on display at the Keyport Fire Museum, located at 86 Broad Street. KFD Chief Edward Lewandowski shares, "The KFD will be 150 years old in 2027. The reorganization has ensured we will continue to serve and protect the public."



The Keyport First Aid Squad was formed in 1927 and is now the oldest operating volunteer First Aid Squad in the United States! Its primary purpose is to provide high-quality emergency medical attention to you and visitors to our town. The first KFAS building was located where Jesus the Lord is today. The current building on Atlantic Street was

built in 1969. Early first aid equipment was limited to simple first aid kits, splints, blankets, a stretcher, and an inhaler. The nearest hospitals in 1918 were South Amboy and Red Bank. Over its history, the squad has consistently evolved, implementing and acquiring modern equipment and lifesaving protocols. The <u>Cadet program</u> feeds the active roster with drivers and EMTs even after they graduate from High School. The KFAS is affiliated with the New Jersey EMS Task Force. One of two Medical Ambulance Buses (MAB) in Monmouth County is housed and operated from the Squad building. Ken Krohe continues as the chief of the KFAS, a position he has held for many years.



# **KEYPORT POLICE DEPARTMENT**

The Keyport Police Department, established on December 13, 1926, has built on a tradition of law enforcement dating back to 1850. In those early days, a town marshal and constable patrolled Keyport's bustling business district and vital wharf areas, laying the foundation for our modern police force. Currently under the guidance of Chief Michael A. Ferm, the department includes a full-time force, dedicated


School Crossing Guards, Special Law Enforcement Officers, and a department secretary and records personnel. As the historic wharves transformed into our beautiful waterfront of today, the Keyport Police Department has also modernized and remains steadfast in its mission, working tirelessly to ensure the safety and well-being of our residents, business owners, and visitors alike. Keyport Police Chief Mike Ferm offers this perspective - "Our blend of historic roots and modern policing practices allows us to serve Keyport with pride, professionalism, and an unwavering commitment to public safety."



# <u>KEYPORT OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT</u>

**Keyport Office of Emergency Management** (OEM) coordinates efforts on a local basis with FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency. Keyport's OEM Coordinators plan and prepare for emergencies, educate the public about preparedness, coordinate response, and prepare, collect, and disseminate emergency information. During Superstorm Sandy in 2012, the Central School became a shelter for anyone needing food and safe lodging. In addition to OEM coordinators and First Responders, residents, school children, and out-of-towners "worked" the shelter around the clock,

prepared and served fresh meals, provided comfort, clothing, and medical needs, and kept those sheltered in touch with loved ones. Secure notification and alert systems are available when you sign up. Check www.keyportonline.com for details. Under OEM authority is the Community Emergency Response Team, or CERT. Members are residents who have been trained to handle responses at a basic level. They are activated to assist other First Responders when all hands are on deck. If you do not have the many hours required to be a firefighter or an EMT, CERT may be a good fit for your available time. It will help you prepare your family and neighbors for emergencies. Deputy OEM Coordinator Jim Lawson reminds everyone, "Sign up for alerts. It is best to know in advance and act before the crisis."

# **ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION**

On June 3, 2025, the Keyport Environmental Commission teamed up with Teacher Ms. Mary Kreiss-Papalski and 30 Volunteer Students from the Somerset County Vocational School to perform a Cedar Street Park Beach Clean-Up.

In the Fall of 2025, the Keyport Environmental Commission is teaming up with the Northern Monmouth Watershed Alliance to work cooperatively with neighboring communities to support the revised requirements of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permitting process by participating in a "Know Your Stream" Day, focused on the Waackaack/Mahoras and Flat Creek Watersheds.

# **BOARD OF HEALTH**

As per State Statute, dogs are required to be licensed in the Borough of Keyport on an annual basis.

You must present a rabies certification that is valid through October of the issuing year.

The fees are as follows dogs \$8.20 for spayed or neutered and \$11.20 if they are not.
